

I. The Law is Light

1. It is easy to stumble in the dark ([Jn. 11:9-10](#)).
 - a. It is not in man that walks to direct his own steps ([Jer. 10:23](#)).
 - b. God must be allowed to direct our paths ([Pr. 3:5-6](#)).
2. God's Law is light ([Pr. 6:23](#)).
 - a. His Word is our guiding light ([Ps. 119:105](#)).
 - b. His Law is trustworthy as a light source ([Ps. 19:7-8](#)).
3. Beware of anyone that would minimize or disparage God's Law and the keeping of it!
 - a. Such a person may appear as a messenger of light but truly is a messenger of Satan ([2 Cor. 11:13-15](#)).
 - b. Without God's Law we would be without a light source to guide our paths.
 - c. Lean towards the light of God's Word.

II. Christ the Light of the World

1. In the beginning was the Word ([Jn. 1:1-9](#)).
2. Jesus declared Himself to be the light of the world ([Jn. 8:12](#), [9:5](#), [12:46](#)).
 - a. The prophets prophesied it and Jesus fulfilled it ([Isa. 9:1-2](#); [Mt. 4:12-16](#); cf. [Lk. 1:78-79](#), [2:32](#)).
3. Jesus declared His disciples to be the light of the world ([Mt. 5:14-16](#)).
 - a. How? By holding forth the word of life ([Php. 2:14-16](#)).
 - b. How? Because we are leaning towards the Light ([Jn. 8:12](#), [12:46](#)).

III. Coming to the Light

1. A well-known passage in a lesser kept context ([Jn. 3:13-21](#)).
 - a. To incline *away* from light is to be evil ([Jn. 3:19-20](#)).
 - b. Those that lean towards the light does truth ([Jn. 3:21](#)).
 - c. There is no communion between light and darkness ([2 Cor. 6:14](#)).
2. Not only must we come to the light we must walk as children of light ([Eph. 5:8-10](#)).
 - a. We must walk in the light as He is in the light ([1 Jn. 1:7](#)).
 - b. Christ called us out of darkness into His marvelous light ([1 Pt. 2:9](#)).
